School Review 2014

Wendy Hubbard, School Reviewer visited today with Rebecca Haig, Senior Advisor Regional Planning and Performance (SARPP) from North Western Victoria Region. Rebecca is my manager. We are reviewing our previous Strategic Plan period and setting directions for our new School Strategic Plan (SSP). Wendy has four field days where she will talk to and observe staff as well as speaking to School Council and members of our community. We have already produced a Draft Strategic plan for 2014 - 2017 and a School Self-Assessment (SSE) that tells of our learning journey over the last four years. With our new building complementing new possibilities this is a great time to be reflecting and setting out on a new Strategic journey. Welcome to my WWA (Wonderful World of Acronyms)!

Building Update - A brand new world of learning at Monty

I am pleased to be able to announce that our site was cleared of asbestos pieces last weekend and site preparation has resumed this week. We attended a site meeting on Tuesday and the new Administration and Multi-Purpose room has a completion date of January 22nd 2015. It will be wonderful to be able to set up a resource/Library area where the temporary office is now located and to make full use of the Art/ Wet Area where the book stock is presently located.

A significant component of our project funding resides in the establishment grants that come with a new building development. We have received a Furniture Grant and will receive a Library Grant and Technology Grant. So far we have held back on expenditure and will need to assess the best strategic use of these financial assets. Most importantly, these funds will translate to your children as a well-resourced impetus for learning when our project is completed.



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
