## School Council Elections - School Surveys the question of SIGNIFICANCE

We sent out over 200 voting papers last Monday and hope to see a significant percentage back when we open the box after the close of voting, 4 pm on Tuesday the $4^{\text {th }}$ of March. It is important that elections are decided by a significant majority, particularly when voting is not compulsory.

We have had small samples in Student Testing and with the return of school surveys in the past. In terms of recent NAPLAN results, grade sample sizes have been small and, although we know we make a huge difference to student learning at all ability ranges, it has been difficult to see significant patterns when we are comparing a group of 14 , for example, to the state population of 60,000 .

Parent Opinion surveys are given out annually to assess your views. We are mandated to give out a certain number but have always doubled this to increase statistical reliability. Despite increasing the number often only $50 \%$ are returned. When our results are published in such places as the Annual Report, the Acara, "My school" they are compromised by the small sample size.

In 2014 we will initiate a School Review which will determine our strategic direction for the next three to five years. We have heard nothing definite from the department about this but part of the process will be surveying our population to find out how you are thinking about the school at present, in the past and for the future. In the past a an external reviewer spoke to members of our community in person. We are not sure if this will happen in the 2014 process. The school values your opinions, when the opportunity comes around please assist us by returning your surveys.

## Co-option to Council

We have one Community position available. Parents can recommend someone to apply for co-option to the community position. Community members can also self-nominate for co-option. Co-option of a community member is done at the first special meeting of the new council ( Straight after the AGM on the $18^{\text {th }}$ of March) which is called specifically for this purpose. This is a closed meeting where co-option submissions are considered by Council.

We also have three Casual vacancies due to resignations. These vacancies will be for the remaining term of the resigning members, that is, until the 2015 election is declared in March 2015. Co-option of a casual vacancy is done at the second special meeting of the new council (Straight after the co-option of the community member on the $18^{\text {th }}$ of March) which is called specifically for this purpose. This is a closed meeting where cooption submissions are considered by council. Parents / Guardians of children at the school can apply to be considered for co-option to School Council as a parent member. Co-opted members will be called to attend the fourth meeting on the night of March $18^{\text {th }}$ - the first meeting of the new School Council in order to elect office bearers and proceed with the meeting.

## Still Wanted - Farmers Market Setup Coordinator

Do you work but want to help out at school? Can you help out at school for a few hours on the $4^{\text {th }}$ Saturday of each month? Then this could be the role for you or to share with another parent!

The farmers market is run on the $4^{\text {th }}$ Saturday of each month from $9 \mathrm{am}-1 \mathrm{pm}$. For continuity, we need a volunteer to be the coordinator responsible for the setup and breakdown process at each market, roughly 8.30-9.30am and then 12.301.30 pm (you would be welcome to stay for the intervening hours as well if you wanted too).

Classes would be rostered to provide helpers to run the BBQ and cake stalls, and to help set up and break down the school stalls. The Market Setup Coordinator will mean school equipment is used and maintained properly. It would be a great help if one person was the font of knowledge for doing this for the market.

The setup coordinator role involves:

- knowing where to find the BBQ, shade tents, and trestle tables
- guiding the provided helpers where and how to set it all up
- get the BBQ up and running
- at the end of the market, guide the helpers to ensure the BBQ is cleaned, shade tents dry and packed away, table and chairs packed away.

P\&F will support this role by coordinating the ordering of food resources (bread, snags, sauce, napkins etc), ensuring there are plenty of helpers and asking for cake donations. (We need a volunteer to do this small role once a month as well.) If you can help out one Saturday morning a month, or help coordinate the preparation part of the market, pls contact Natalie Duffy.
