Principal's Report

Anaphylaxis and Allergies - No shared food. Please assist us

If a child is at risk, due to the likelihood of an allergic reaction, a management plan is lodged with the school and the appropriate medication provided by parents. The school has its role to play.

In line with recent upgrades to policy, you will notice that we have information regarding anaphylaxis and allergies posted outside each room. Students at risk have plans prominently displayed in the sick bay and relevant locations around the school such as the kitchen and Out of School Hours Care. The school has also run whole—staff Level 2 First Aid this year so we have a high level of knowledge regarding risk and treatment. I commend the staff for their willingness to participate in this intensive, out-of-hours training. We have also updated our policy and backed it up with the purchase of additional Epipens and Asthma medications to ensure the safety of children at risk. No sharing of food is critical and this is the approach recommended by the Royal Children's Hospital.

How you can help:

Please back up our "No Shared Food" policy. Make sure that your child's medication plan is up to date and do the same for any medications needed. Whilst it is impossible to enforce a "nut free" school for example, due to the number of foods processed in facilities that also process nuts, items such as peanut butter sandwiches should be kept for the home. If you are bringing birthday treats please let the class teacher know in advance. Parents of children with allergies can supply treats to be given out when it is someone's birthday.

Our New Building - The excitement is building as well.

As you can see this is at lock-up stage and on target for a Term 3 start – exciting! We are aiming to move out in the last week of Term 2 – this is to ensure that the current rooms and admin can be demolished over the June/July holiday break. The building contains asbestos sheeting in the guidance officers' corridor, staff toilets, breezeway roof and one run of eaves in the bike cage. Other eaves were replaced in the BER process. Although this does not amount to much, and is not dangerous, the holiday demolition will ensure that children will not be exposed to any risk.

How you can help:

We are meeting with parents and friends to look at mobilizing parent teams around the time of moving in. Michael Smith, School Council buildings and Grounds, has been doing a lot of thinking around the order of events that might need to be established. The current Phys Ed store needs to be moved to the Water Tank Shed and if old records could be cleared from the castle mezzanine, our office storeroom could be cleared, for example. If you have any time you can give around such tasks keep your eye out for future communications or just let us know.
