# **Principal's Report**

We are two weeks away from being able to move furniture into our wonderful new building – very exciting. The weekend of the 21 (8.00-4.00pm)and 22 June (9.00-4.00pm)will be one huge Working bee in order to set up. Help is appreciated, with Michael Smith (School Council Buildings and Grounds Convenor) doing a great job of coordinating the move. Michael's effort and expertise has been exceptional but I have also been humbled and extremely grateful for the effort offered by so many parents. There are a myriad of jobs, small and large, that will make a huge difference to the move. So many families and individuals have given generously of whatever time they could spare – it all adds up to ensure a smooth and productive transition. There are lists of jobs on the noticeboard in the foyer and any time you can give us in the next for weeks will be greatly appreciated. The work of the school cannot stop of course. Staff have been busy with reports, a little earlier than is usual, in order to concentrate their efforts on the move and have also been streamlining and downsizing. Reports will be ready go out in the last week of term with interviews in Term 3.

There are eight classroom spaces, an Art space and a Library space within the learning area and Grade 5/6, Grade 4/5, Grade 3, Grade 1/2 A&B, Foundation S, Foundation K and Foundation Green will set up there. Foundation Red and Blue will use our new portable building – it will be refurbished by the way. Sarah and Anna are really excited about the team teaching possibilities! Music and Physical Education will have some space in The Castle and the Kitchen will still double as an Art Room until we are established and can look at moving the Art supplies. The General Office will set up in the Library/ Resource area temporarily- not in a tent on the oval as previously indicated. Office access will be through the south doors of the building as the north doors will still be part of the building site.

How welcoming our school will look when the two buildings, set back, all on one level and with a welcoming space between them, are completed! As a bonus, it will all be in place for the start of the 2015 school year.

#### School Review - Two Important Surveys

In Term 3 we will be conducting our School Review. As we have grown we have directed our efforts at creating a team atmosphere involving ongoing review of our Curriculum and Welfare philosophy and practices. A review is very much about the plans we are making to go forward based on our self-knowledge. We have been forming up Strategic Directions for some time and have a draft Strategic Plan in place for future feedback. In the coming weeks two important documents will be distributed. One is about our choice of a language to be introduced in 2015. The other is a survey to ascertain and confirm your understandings of where we are at present and what future directions might augment the journey. The Department of Education puts out surveys each year but we are interested in a more immediate and relevant snapshot of your views to feed into our newly drafted Strategic
