It has been a great start to the year – the children are really settled and are already working productively. There is a lot to communicate so please excuse the point form.

- Welcome to Manny Kechayas, (0.8 Physical Education and Senior Music) and Junko Nichols (0.2 Foundation Japanese). Welcome also to Nicole Gardner who is in for Christine Turner in Term One. Christine has been diagnosed with breast cancer and we wish her well as she sorts out treatment and recovery. Louise Williams is also on board as a supporting Teacher.
- Our Grade 1/2 groups are large but our highly capable classroom teachers are well-supported by additional staff. Lou Williams works in the classrooms when Foundation groups are at specialists and Kay Rowland and Colleen Bramall are also working with these groups as Education Support Officers. We will be able to commit funds towards extra teaching assistance in the Grade 1/2 area when our 2015 Budget is confirmed on Census Day, 27 February.
- We will have our **first contact interviews**, for **Grade 1-6**, on Wednesday 25 February. In line with local school practice, and with the aim of allowing an adequate time frame for these first contact interviews, this will be a **reporting day** with children **not at school**. **OSHC will be offered for the day**.

- We have a **parent helper information** session this **Friday morning at 9:30am** where Janene Worsam, our **Leading Teacher** and **Second-in-Charge**, will give insight into ways to assist in the classroom.

Don't forget the first Nude Food Day of 2015 on Thursday the 5th of February! At Montmorency Primary School, educating children to make healthy decisions for their bodies and the environment is a vital aspect of our educational program. Nude Food Day combines both environmental awareness and nutritional health by building greater understanding of the effects that our food choices have on our bodies and the effects that rubbish/waste have on our environment.

Nude Food Day teaches children the importance of a nutritious and environmentally friendly lunch filled with fresh and nutritious food, eliminating all unnecessary wrapping.

What is Nude Food? Nude Food is simply food that is not wrapped in foil, plastic or commercial packaging.

To pack a Nude Food lunch or snack you will need:	Try to avoid:			
 Cutlery from home, which is better than throwaway plastic cutlery Plastic or metal drink bottles for refilling with water Reusable containers for putting all of your food, snacks and drinks into Lunch boxes that have lots of separate sections, which can be useful to avoid lost lids or containers 	 Zip lock or plastic bags, plastic wrap or aluminium foil Tetra packed drinks, single serve yoghurts and cheese Single use plastic forks and spoons Pre-packaged food, like biscuits, snack bars and chips
