Curriculum News

Last week the National Curriculum Review Report was released. The Australian Government established this review in January 2014 and aimed to evaluate the robustness, independence and balance of the process and development of the Australian Curriculum. It also sought to understand whether the Australian Curriculum is delivering what students need, parents expect and the nation requires in an increasingly competitive world. There will be a Q & A Forum about the National Curriculum Review Report held at the University of Melbourne on 30 October from 4:00 – 6:30pm. This will be an excellent opportunity to learn more about the review and hear from expert panelists: Brian Caldwell, Professor University of Melbourne, Chris Wardlaw, Executive Manager of the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority and Maxine McKew former PM, Fellow at the Melbourne University Graduate School and author of recently published 'Class Act'. This is a complimentary event for interested parents and educators. I will be eagerly attending this event.
