

Montmorency Primary School STATEMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

Preamble

Montmorency Primary School is a unique, small school set near the heart of Montmorency Shopping Village. Our mission is to provide a safe, supportive and positive environment embodying quality learning opportunities in order to maximise academic, social and community potential. Our core values of 'Learning, Friendship, Safety and Respect' underpin our goal of 'Preparation for Life'. Our Strategic Plan promotes the teaching of skills and values which are aligned with the emerging requirements of the third millennium.

Montmorency Primary School has an excellent staff:student ratio. Teaching and support staff are experienced and enthusiastic and are backed up by an energised and supportive community. We have earned a reputation for connectedness, caring for others, developing individuals and linking learning to hands-on, engaging experiences. The core curriculum is complemented by specialist classes in Visual and Performing Arts, Physical Education and a pilot Japanese program at Foundation level. Japanese was chosen as our Language other than English and will be introduced in Foundation classes in 2015. We are also fortunate to offer the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program in purpose-built facilities. Montmorency Primary School has forged links with local growers and environmental groups in order to create a welcoming, open environment reflective of sustainable practices. Regular open events such as our Farmers Market complement our inclusive environment.

Our school is currently being rebuilt as part of a \$4 million dollar upgrade. Children moved in to their new classrooms at the commencement of Term 3, 2014. Our new spaces have been designed to provide a home-room feel and to allow our highly competent staff to impart their skills explicitly. Operable walls allow the classrooms to open up to the central area for co-operative work allowing for interchange between staff and children and modelling the connectedness of our unique school. A new Administration and Multipurpose block will be completed by February 2015. Montmorency Primary is looking forward to an even brighter future!
